A Quick Outlook on Israel and other events

- Increasingly polarizing support for Antisemitism and Hamas causes in both America and Abroad
- => Increasing civil disobedience and terror threats everywhere
- Organizations like the United Nations, and the World Health Organization, as well as the Pope are pushing cease fire narratives for Israel. Condemning Israel while not mentioning the killing of Kurds by Turkey, the Mulsim death tolls in Syria, the extermination of Christians and Jews in Africa
- Between 6000 and 8000 migrants are in Mexico heading for the US border. People we don't vet, don't track, no intention of assimilation, terrorists, criminals, gangs, and drugs and diseases are coming
- Election interference by people to get Trump off the ballot, out him in jail, or make his run for office impossible. Using **"LawFare"** to do it.
- War against Hamas nearing end, but northern front heating up. Attacking Churches, Mosques, Schools, Monasteries killing civilians and soldiers.
- Yemen, and violence in the area of Samaria and Judea increasing and being promoted by Iran
- Countries around the world are taking sides, breeding violence in Europe, Africa, South America, and America. Alliances of Russia, Turkey, Iran, and others are solidifying

1 John Ch 1:1-4 The Incarnation of the Word of Life

1 That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked at and our hands have touched—<u>this</u> we proclaim concerning the <u>Word (Logos) of life.</u>

² The life appeared; we have seen it and testify to it, and we proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and has appeared to us.

³ We proclaim to you what we have seen and heard, so that you also may have <u>fellowship</u> with us. And our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son, Jesus Christ.

⁴ We write this to make our (your) joy complete.

Gospel of John Ch1:1-5. Word of Life

1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

² He was with God in the beginning.

³ Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made.

⁴ In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind.

⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

Christian Fellowship is grounded in 4 Principles

- **1.** The Testimony of God's Word without this undergirding us, we do not have Christian Fellowship
- **2. Fellowship is mutual** It depends on the Unity of Believers in the Essentials of the Faith
- **3.** Fellowship is renewed daily by the Holy Spirit The Holy Spirit living in us adds to the social, and spiritual relationship between believers and God. This "living" relationship with Christ and the Spirit accomplishes this
- **4.** *Christian Fellowship requires adherence to Truth*. In the case of these heresies, loyalty to Jesus and the Word, rather than the knowledge of man.

1 John 1: 5-7. Light and Darkness

⁵ This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all.

⁶ If we claim to have fellowship with him and yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live out the truth.

⁷ But if we <u>walk in the light</u>, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all (every) sin. 1 John Ch 1:8-10 Sin and Forgiveness

⁸ If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us.

⁹ If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.

¹⁰ If we claim we have not sinned, we make him out to be a liar and his word is not in us.
