 - Sexual immorality, Incest, Adultery, Fornication
 - Suing one another, pitting each other up for failure, a culture of public debasement
 - Selfish "Rights" attitudes
 - Abusing of the Lord's Supper
 - Propriety in Church, whole discussion about modesty
 - Euphoria and Ecstasy in worship (Ch 12)
 - Agape Love undergirds all the Gifts
- In Ch 14, Paul comes back and deals again with Tongues/Languages, and Prophecy...plus roles of women

1 Cor Ch 14:1-2

14 Follow the way of love and eagerly desire gifts of the Spirit, especially prophecy.

² For anyone who speaks in **a** tongue does not speak to people but to God. Indeed, no one understands them; they utter mysteries by the Spirit.

³ But the one who prophesies **speaks to people for their strengthening, encouraging and comfort.**

1 Cor Ch 14:4-5

⁴ Anyone who speaks in **a** tongue edifies themselves, but the one who prophesies edifies the church.

tongues, but I would rather have you prophesy. The one who prophesies is greater than the one who speaks in tongues, unless someone interprets, so that the church may be edified.

Note: In the KJV where "a" is there they add "Unknown", not in plural cases

Some consider the unknown tongue to be an unknown language, such as gibberish which there is only one version

1 Cor Ch 14:6-12

- ⁶ Now, brothers and sisters, if I come to you and speak in tongues, what good will I be to you, unless I bring you some revelation or knowledge or prophecy or word of instruction?
- ⁷ Even in the case of lifeless things that make sounds, such as the pipe or harp, how will anyone know what tune is being played unless there is a distinction in the notes?
- ⁸ Again, if the trumpet does not sound a clear call, who will get ready for battle?
- ⁹ So it is with you. Unless you speak intelligible words with your tongue, how will anyone know what you are saying? You will just be speaking into the air.
- ¹⁰ Undoubtedly there are all sorts of languages in the world, yet none of them is without meaning.
- ¹¹ If then I do not grasp the meaning of what someone is saying, I am a foreigner to the speaker, and the speaker is a foreigner to me.
- ¹² So it is with you. Since you are eager for gifts of the Spirit, try to excel in those that build up the church.

1 Cor Ch 14:13-17

- ¹³ For this reason the one who speaks in a tongue should pray that they may interpret what they say.
- ¹⁴ For if I pray in a tongue, my spirit prays, **but my mind is unfruitful.**
- ¹⁵ So what shall I do? I will pray with my spirit, but I will also pray with my understanding; I will sing with my spirit, but I will also sing with my understanding.
- ¹⁶ Otherwise when you are praising God in the Spirit, how can someone else, who is now put in the position of an **inquirer**, say "Amen" to your thanksgiving, since they do not know what you are saying?
- ¹⁷ You are giving thanks well enough, but no one else is edified.

1 Cor Ch 14:18-21

¹⁸ I thank God that I speak in tongues more than all of you. ¹⁹ But in the church, I would rather speak five intelligible words to instruct others than ten thousand words in a tongue.

²⁰ Brothers and sisters, stop thinking like children. In regard to evil be infants, but in your thinking be adults.

²¹ In the Law it is written:

"With other tongues and through the lips of foreigners I will speak to this people, but even then, they will not listen to me, says the Lord." (Isa 28:11-12)

1 Cor Ch 14:22-25

- ²² Tongues, then, are a **sign**, not for believers but for unbelievers; prophecy, however, is not for (making)unbelievers but for (making)believers.
- ²³ So if the whole church comes together and everyone speaks in tongues(languages), and inquirers or unbelievers come in, will they not say that you are out of your mind?
- ²⁴ But if an unbeliever or an inquirer comes in while everyone is prophesying, they are convicted of sin and are brought under judgment by all,
- ²⁵ as the secrets of their hearts are laid bare. So, they will fall down and worship God, exclaiming, "God is really among you!"

1 Cor Ch 14:26-32 Good order in Worship

- ²⁶ What then shall we say, brothers and sisters? When you come together, each of you has a hymn, or a word of instruction, a revelation, a tongue or an interpretation. **Everything must be done so that the church may be built up.**
- ²⁷ If anyone speaks in a tongue, two—or at the most three—should speak, **one at a** time, and someone must interpret.
- ²⁸ If there is no interpreter, the speaker should keep quiet in the church and speak to himself and to God.
- ²⁹ Two or three prophets should speak, and the others should weigh carefully what is said.
- ³⁰ And if a revelation comes to someone who is sitting down, the first speaker should stop.
- ³¹ For **you can all prophesy in turn** so that everyone may be instructed and encouraged.
- ³² The spirits of prophets are subject to the control of prophets.
- ³³ For God is not a God of disorder but of peace—as in all the congregations of the Lord's people.

1 Cor Ch 14:33-34 ... A complicated set of verses

³⁴ (As in all the congregations of the Lord's people,)

Women should remain silent in the churches. They are not allowed to speak, but must be in submission, as the law says.

³⁵ If they want to inquire about something, they should ask their own husbands at home; for it is disgraceful for a woman to speak in the church.

Here we go again...let me do the best I can with these verses.

Context and details are important

In Genesis ... Punishment for the Fall

Gen 3:16 Youngs Literal Translation

¹⁶ Unto the woman He said, `Multiplying I multiply thy sorrow and thy conception, in sorrow dost thou bear children, and toward thy husband [is] thy desire, and he doth rule over thee.'

¹⁷ And to the man He said, `Because thou hast hearkened to the voice of thy wife, and dost eat of the tree concerning which I have charged thee, saying, Thou dost not eat of it, cursed [is] the ground on thine account; in sorrow thou dost eat of it all days of thy life...

What does it all mean?

1 Cor Ch 36-40 ... Paul answers a sticky response

- ³⁶ Or did the word of God originate with you? Or are you the only people it has reached?
- ³⁷ If anyone thinks they are a prophet or otherwise gifted by the Spirit, let them acknowledge that what I am writing to you is the Lord's command.
- ³⁸ But if anyone ignores this, they will themselves be ignored.
- ³⁹ Therefore, my brothers and sisters, be eager to prophesy, and do not forbid speaking in tongues.
- ⁴⁰ But everything should be done in a fitting and orderly way.
